Plans For Austin Trip.

Final plans for the trip to Austin have been made. Two special trains over the I. & G. N. will leave College at 7:10 o'clock, arriving at Austin at 10:30. The cadet corps will not be under arms, but senior officers will wear side arms. The corps will attend the inauguration ceremonies when Dr. R. E. Vinson is inducted into the office of president of the University.

The trains will leave Austin for College at 12:00, midnight, and 12:10 o'clock. Each section will have standard sleepers, tourist sleepers, and day coaches. The fare will be \$1.50 for the round trip.
