

# Baylor Beats Aggies to Clinch SWC Title

## Cage Season Scheduled to Close With Arkansas Series Next Week

feeling the other out. After 10 minutes had slipped by the score stood at 10-7, Aggies. During the entire first half the Aggies led, and it looked as if it might be another 23 years before the Bruins would win a championship.

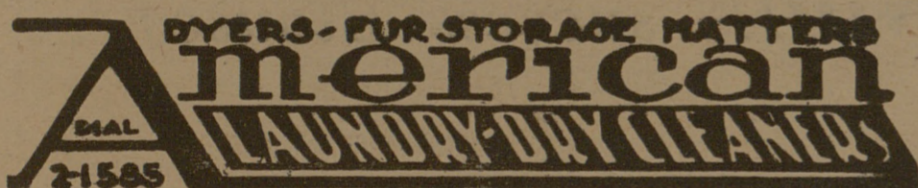
