For the second straight day, Fortenberry put on a fine shooting exhibition yesterday, steadily pumping in onehanders from around and outside the free throw circle.

Rose probably will start Norman Smith, who scored 19 in the TCU game, letterman Buddy Smith, Jerald Barnett, last year's leading scorer as a sophomore, Carroll Scroggins, a two year letterman, and Walter Butler, a junior college transfer.
