Agronomists and range and forestry men are also needed. The current call for engineers is separate from a recent announcement of civil service examinations open to students interested in the SCS summer employment program.

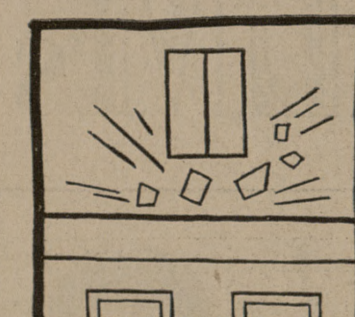

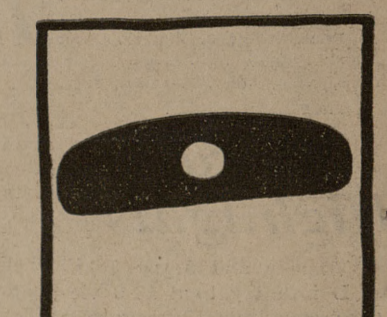

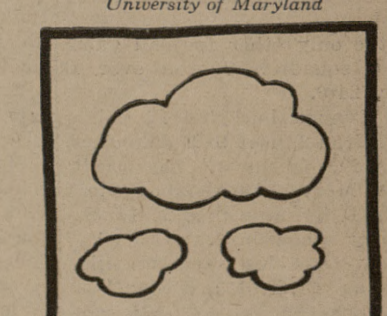
ELEVATOR ARRIVING AT 5TH FLOOR OF 3-STORY BUILDING
