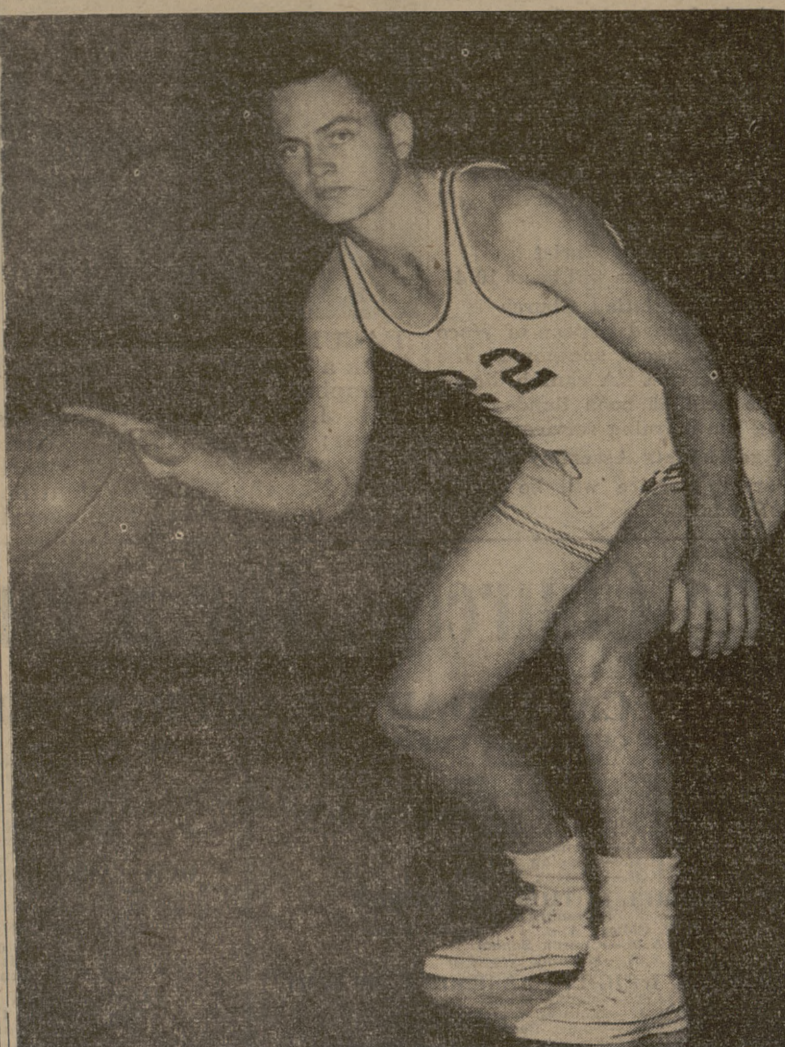

# Aggies Face Tall Baylor Team, Fish Battle Cubs Tomorrow

A&M faces the tall, talented but erratic Baylor Bears here tomorrow night in a contest that could see the Aggies escape the Southwest conference cellar.

The Aggie Fish open tomorrow night's activities at 6 p.m., and the varsity game begins at 8. KORA will broadcast the contest.

If third-place Arkansas wins over Texas at Fayetteville and the Aggies down Baylor, A&M and UT will be tied with 2-7 records.

The Aggies lost their second starting player when forward Don Bibrey injured his shoulder again in the SMU game. Bibrey will be out for the rest of the season.

Two of the Aggies' top scorers, George Mehaffey and Bill Brophy, managed only eight points between them in the SMU game. They should be on the rebound this week. Guard Ted Harrod pumped in 23 points, and John Fortenberry bucketed 15 in the Mustang game, indicating they are steadily improving.

"We may change our defense for the Baylor game," said Coach John Floyd, "and we will play a looser offense than against SMU."

The Bears have come up with one of the smoothest sophomores in the conference in 6-5 Jerry Mallett.

Mallett's deadly one-hand set shot from around the free throw circle has helped vault him into fourth place in conference scoring.

Another outstanding Bruin this season has been Murray Bailey, a 6-2 forward who led Baylor in scoring last year with 311 points. He has ranked among the nation's leaders in free throws for the past two seasons. Last year he dropped in 137 of 176 free throw tries.

Don Dickson, Baylor's 6-8 center, adds still more experience and height to the fast breaking Bear offense.

A&M's freshman squad will go against a revenge-bent team of Baylor Cubs in the first game. The Fish eased past the Cubs in Waco earlier this season 72-71.

Fifty-six fouls were called in the turbulent contest as four Fish and three Cubs fouled out.

Guard Bryan Sutherlin leads the Aggie Fish in point making over the season with 141. He has hit 52 of 121 field goal tries and 37 of 52 free throws.

He is also second in rebounds with 79.

Willard Hutto is second in scoring with 91 points on 35 field goals and 21 free throws.

Freshman guard J. C. Smith will miss the Baylor game because of a hurt knee.

## Earle Wins Nod, Eckard Floored

Jim Earle won his 37th fight in 40 starts last night in Fort Worth and survived as A&M's only entry in the state Golden Gloves meet.

Earle, winning the first two rounds, took a decision from Marvin Crow of Dallas to gain the quarterfinals of the lightweight division. He doesn't fight again until Saturday night.

Aggie Featherweight Connie Eckard suffered a first-round knockout by Baltazar Flores of Beaumont, one of the meet title favorites.

Flores floored Eckard in the first flurry of the bout, then put him down for keeps later in the round.

## Ag Soccer Team Plays U of H Here

A&M's undefeated soccer team, defending Texas International Soccer league champs, opens its league season here Sunday with the University of Houston.

Game time is 2:30 p.m. at the new soccer field east of Anchor hall and south of White coliseum. There is no admission charge.

## 110 Coaches Attend BU Football Clinic

WACO, Tex., Feb. 18—(AP)—More than 110 high school and junior college football coaches from Texas and Louisiana registered yesterday for Baylor's annual 3-day football coaching clinic.

The coaches heard Baylor Coach George Sauer talk on "running game and ball handling" and Steve Owen lecture on "defensive tactics." The visiting coaches saw movies of the 1954 Baylor-SMU game.

**DEAD EYE**—Guard Ted Harrod, a 6-0 sophomore, probably will start for the Aggies against Baylor here tomorrow night. Leading A&M scorer in the SMU game with 23 points, Harrod has a fine jump shot and is a good 'driver'. He led last year's Fish team with 190 points and a 15.9 average.

# Ag Swimmers Edge Texas 44-40

AUSTIN, Feb. 18—(AP)—A&M 200-yard free style in 2:21.7. In topped favored Texas last night 44-40 in a Southwest Conference dual swimming meet.

The Aggies unofficially bettered two conference records in splashing to the victory. Neither mark will count because records must be broken in the conference meet.

A&M won the 300-yard medley relay in 3:02.1. The existing mark is 3:05.3 by Texas. The Aggie team was composed of Norman Ufer, Dick Weick and John Speich.

Weick clipped .3 second off the existing 200-yard individual medley mark, winning in 2:17.7.

Dick Hunkler of A&M won the 50-yard free style in 23.7 seconds and the 100-yard free style in 54.5 seconds. Ufer won the 200-yard backstroke in 2:22.4.

Weick swam to victory in the 220-yard breast stroke in 2:39.8.

Texas won four first places. J. L. Neal of the Longhorns took the

200-yard free style in 2:21.7. In diving, Louis Million placed first. Charlton Hadden won the 440-yard free style in 5:09.7. In the final race, the Longhorns took the 440-yard free style in 3:41.1. The team was made up of Pat Patterson, Robert Bell, Dave Fennekohl and Neal.
