Dwayne S. (Dub) Bailey, sophomore business major from Port Arthur, yesterday was elected president of the Baptist Student

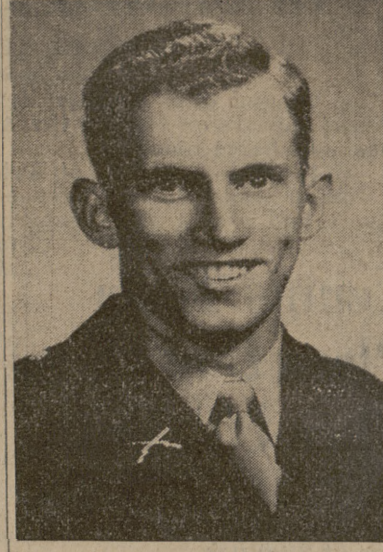
Union Executive council for 1955-56 school year.
