Orient Visitors Study Methods Of Insurance

Six representatives of the Japanese insurance system, "Mutual Relief", visited the campus yesterday to study methods of insuring agricultural products.

They will study premium collection methods, information methods, public relation and insurance sales work for wheat and cotton while they are here.

After finishing here, they went to Lafayette, La., and then on a tour through Washington, D. C., South Carolina, Florida, Ohio, Illinois, and Colorado.

The representatives will report the results of their studies to the Japanese Ministry of Agriculture. Information about U. S. agriculture will be distributed in Japan in magazines and pamphlets to the 5-million farmers insured by "Mutual Relief" each year.

The representatives were Nihei Fujimoto, Ichiji Shimoyama, Haruki Shirashi, Kunyi Tanaka, Hiroshi Kuwahata and Kohochi Yashima.
