## New President Named In Brazilian Revolt

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) - Anti-Communist rebels seeking to oust leftist President Joao Goulart had Paschoal Ranieri Mazzili, president of the Chamber of Deputies, sworn in as Brazil's new president today.

Auro Moura Andrade, president of the Brazilian Senate, declared the presidency vacant after a two-day military and political revolt against Goulart. Moura Andrade asked Mazzilli to assume the office as Goulart's constitutional successor.

Mazzilli, next in line because Brazil has no vice president, took the oath of office in a brief ceremony at 3:30 a.m. in Brasilia, the inland capital.

Goulart's steady drift to the left had aroused staunch conservative, anti-communist and Roman Catholic opposition. The Communist China.

tensions came to a climax last week with a 40-hour mutiny by 1,425 sailors against conservative control of the navy.

On Monday, a U. S. State Department official in Washington said the situation in Brazil has "steadily deteriorated" and expressed concern over increasing Communist influence in the largest and potentially richest country in Latin America.

Texas political candidates. Congressional candidates were the only ones that would have been directly affected by immediate enforcement of a court order for congress-at-large races until the state is redistricted.

Candidates for other races, particularly for state house and senate, feared that an order for immediate enforcement would result in a special legislative session just before the May 2 primary.

The Houston court, in effect, allowed the state to wait until the 1965 Legislature before reshuffling congressional districts. Meanwhile, considerable activity continued on the campaign front.

U. S. Sen. Ralph Yarborough, D-Tex., opened his Dallas headquarters with two brothers, H. J. and Donald Yarborough, both Dallas attorneys, helping.

Robert Morris, Republican Candidate for U. S. "A tax credit is subtracted from the final income tax total a person must pay the government," Morris said.



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
