## MARRIAGE FORUM

# Bowman Weighs College Marriage Assets, Problems

Dr. Henry Bowman of the University of Texas weighed the problems and advantages of college marriages in the YMCA's second Marriage Forum Tuesday night.

"If you can't have the best marriages in the world, then who can?" Bowman asked the student audience.

"I like to see people wait until they are at least 20 (for marriage)," he added.

Problems of "putting husband through college," according to Bowman, include:

1. Reversal of roles — man's ego is threatened when his wife is the bread-winner.
2. Total load carried and the special pressures involved — with both husband and wife serving double duty as student and laborer. Special pressures build up, often causing misunderstanding and conflict.
3. Housing — thin walls, limited space leads to confusion and distraction.
4. Limits man in freedom of choice — because of family responsibility, it is more difficult to change majors, pursue higher degrees.

Solutions listed by Bowman:

1. High quality person entering the marriage. They must be able to tolerate these circumstances.
2. Some yielding of traditional roles.
3. Realize it is only a temporary hardship.

"Nothing takes the place of the quality of persons involved," the speaker noted.

- Advantages:
1. Security.
  2. Emotional support.
  3. Freedom to live together with the kind of freedom that unmarrieds don't have.
  4. Time element — hours previously spent dating are eliminated.
- Five factors influencing a successful marriage, Bowman said, are:

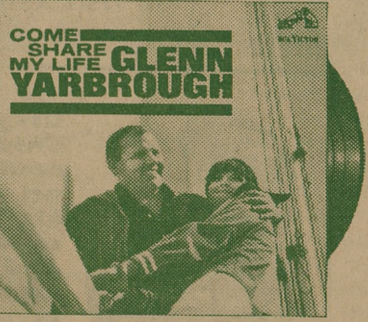
1. Motivation — the will to succeed; determination.
2. Perspective — able to put little annoyances into perspective.
3. Ego surrender — the recognition that the marriage is bigger than the people in it.
4. Critical self-analysis — what effect are you having on other people, especially the other marriage partner?
5. Acceptance — accept the other person both as a person and as a member of the opposite sex with different attitudes, philosophies and outlooks.

Bowman also listed eight reasons why marriages fail. Included were: conflict; interference from other goals; fear or jealousy; unacceptable circumstances; role expectations; outworn attitudes; sex separated from love, and petty annoyances which get out of proportion.

## Rice Editor Gets Reconsideration

HOUSTON — William Timme, student Association president at Rice University raised a question Tuesday night about the fairness of the "due process" review to be given Rice Thresher Editor, Hugh Rice Kelley.

Kelley was put on disciplinary probation and removed from the editorship for "flaunting administrative authority and refusing to speak with Rice's Dean of Students Dr. S. W. Higginbotham."

In a meeting with Rice presi-

dent, Kenneth Pitzer, Tuesday morning, the Student Association was told that Kelley could appeal his case.

"He will go back and talk to the dean. If he does not agree to a compromise to Kelley's liking, Kelley may appeal the decision to Pitzer, said Timme. He could conceivably appeal the case to the Board of Directors.

"The probation papers must be signed by the president before they become effective, continued Timme. Therefore, in signing Kelley's probation papers, Pitzer agreed with the charge and with the punishment."

"Although I am sure that both Pitzer and Higginbotham will be as impartial as they can, how can they, if they were parties to the punishment in the first place?" said Timme.

Before the meeting, the students had been told by a university official that no appeal would be available to Kelley.

However, at the meeting, Pitzer said a review would be available. A petition asking for "due process" in student disciplinary action, and signed by 108 Rice instructors was given to Pitzer.

The Rice professors have unanimously approved a document of the American Association of University Professors which contains approval of "due process" in handling student disciplinary matters.

## Graduate Council Positions Open

Filing is now open for positions on the Graduate Student Council. The deadline is Friday and students may file in the Graduate College Office in the Coke Building.

Graduate students who are registered for eight or more hours and whose academic record is satisfactory are eligible to run for the council.

Three members of the council will be elected from the College of Agriculture, four from the College of Arts and Sciences three from the College of Engineering, one from the Institute of Statistics.

These positions compose the entire membership of the council.

## Robert Boone Announces 11 Singing Cadets

Eleven new members have been added to the Singing Cadets, official glee club of A&M.

The new members include Gene P. Burroughs, a junior from Baytown; Joseph A. Slivinske, a freshman from State College, Pa.; Barry S. Rodgers, a freshman from Dallas and Thomas W. Hewett, a sophomore from Freeport.

Others named were William B. Stack, a freshman from Groves; Lohn F. Yoder, a freshman from Fort Worth; Robert Mark Clausen, a freshman from Humble and Henry Y. Chou, a graduate student from Pittsburgh, Pa.

David S. Butler, and Fred L. May, freshmen from San Antonio and Francis A. Tice, a freshman from Rockport, round out the appointments.

Robert L. "Bob" Boone, director of the 52-member group, said the 11 have replaced students who graduated and those who failed to maintain the necessary grade point ratio.

The Singing Cadets are also the official glee club of the Miss Teen Age America pageant, held each November in Dallas and televised nationally. Later this month the Singing Cadets are to tape two songs for a Houston television station for showing in May.
