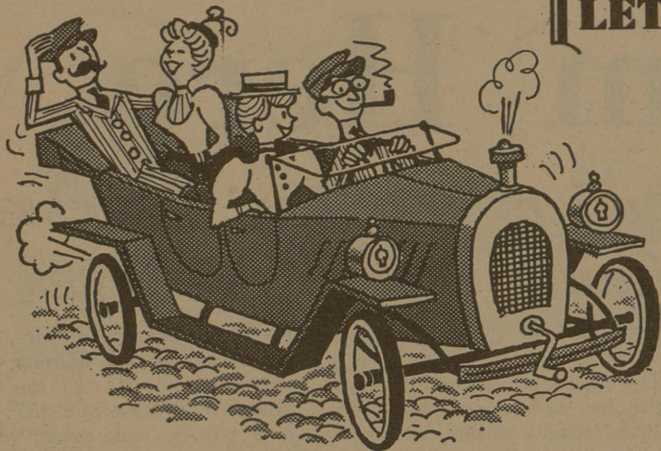

Biological Study Gets Grant Boost

The U. S. Public Health Service has renewed a grant to A&M for primary biological study in the northeastern Gulf of Mexico and raised the total grant to \$87,000, President Earl Rudder was notified Wednesday.

The new grant of \$33,367 is effective May 1. First-year operations have been financed by a \$33,552 grant.

Dr. S. Z. El-Sayed, a biological oceanographer, is principal investigator for the two-year study. The biological study utilizes facilities of A&M's broader environmental study underway at Panama City, Fla., using offshore platforms originally built for the Navy. Roy D. Gaul directs the broader project.

The primary productivity research directed by El-Sayed is

concerned with microscopic organisms of the sea. Their function compares to grass on the cattle range.

"We are trying," El-Sayed said, "to interpret the effect of environmental conditions on primary productivity of the area. Also, this study provides us an excellent opportunity to compare productivity of a subtropical region and the subarctic and Antarctic."

The A&M faculty member in the Department of Oceanography and Meteorology directs a study of primary productivity southward from Argentina into Antarctica.

Monthly cruises into the Gulf of Mexico westward from Panama City and weekly sampling from the offshore platforms are key factors in the study of that area.

Professor Enrique Balech, a visiting scientist here from Argentina, is connected with identification of the microorganisms taken in samples. He has an international reputation for studies of marine microorganisms and has worked on four continents.

A. Bresba assists El-Sayed at Panama City and A&M graduate student Dean Norris works on samples returned here. Norris' work is for his masters' degree studies.

Smorgasbord Set

The Latin American smorgasbord originally scheduled for April 9 has been rescheduled for April 13 to coincide with the Town Hall presentation of "Ballet Folklorico of Mexico."

Enrique Serna, chairman of Pan American Week at A&M, said those attending the smorgasbord may now plan an outing for the entire evening.

The smorgasbord is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. in the Memorial Student Center, and the "Ballet Folklorico of Mexico" is slated for 8 p.m. in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

Groundbreaking Plans Set
