They've won four of the last five national titles, including two in a row. And, since the 7-foot-1 Alcindor appeared on the scene. they've lost only two games in three seasons.

standing collegiate player in the history of the game, has compiled an equally outstanding personal record — three times All-American, twice Player of the Year.

They're physically healthy and, according to Coach John Wooden, mentally and emotionally ready to make their bid to become the first team in history to win three consecutive national titles.

"Our biggest problem is final exams," Wooden said Wednesday after the team arrived from Los Angeles. Drake, North Carolina and Purdue also made late afternoon arrivals and each took a one-hour workout.

"It's our first practice since before the regionals," Wooden said. "We've had final exams and had to lay off. I don't think it will make too much difference. We've reached a point that we hadn't attained in some time."
