The Physical Plant Department has assumed responsibility for maintaining the park, however no official funds, staff, or time are devoted to the park. The park is mowed only when other jobs on campus are completed.

Currently Hensel Park is covered with litter consisting of paper, beer cans, and other assorted articles.




