day. There will be no courtroom session because of a legal holiday.
The 13th day of the trial ended emotionally for the pale defendant Thursday as the government played for the jury a tape from the SLA featuring Miss Hearst saying she voluntarily joined her captors in the bank heist.

The frail young woman wept when she heard the strident, angry voice of SLA chieftain Donald "Cinque" DeFreeze spew a cold, militaristic account of the bank robbery.
Her shoulders shook visibly, and tears rolled down her face. She seemed to

slightly regain her composure when a voice now identified as Harris railed about the news media and authorities fanning racism.

However, when her voice, soft but brimming with disdain, spoke as "Tania, a soldier in the people's army" she bowed her head and nervously rubbed her temple and lips.

Carter stared at the defendant when she referred to Weed on the tape as a "sexist, ageist pig" and then turned toward the recording machine again.

Her father, San Francisco Examiner president Randolph Hearst, stiffened when she called him "Adolf," presumably a reference to Adolf Hitler.

Her mother, Catherine, sat stone-faced, but the seven women and five men of the jury appeared enraptured as they followed her words with a government-prepared transcript.

The jury must decide whether Miss Hearst was forced under threat of death to rob the bank and make the dramatic tape, as she has testified outside their presence.

DeFreeze and five other SLA members were killed in a gun battle with Los Angeles

'Maniacs' explode bomb in Hearst Castle

SAN SIMEON, Calif. — Patricia Hearst's parents blame "maniacs" for the \$1-million-plus bombing of an ornate guest house at the fabled Hearst Castle while their daughter is on trial in San Francisco.

There were no warning calls Thursday before the blast ripped through a building which 53 tourists had passed through just three minutes earlier, authorities said.

San Luis Obispo County sheriff's deputies said there were no arrests and no suspects. The FBI was investigating phone calls to two San Francisco radio stations claiming the New

World Liberation Front was responsible for the explosion here, 150 miles south of San Francisco.

The NWLF is a terrorist group that has claimed responsibility for numerous San Francisco Bay area bombings.

Deputies said at least \$1 million worth of treasures were damaged in the Casa del Sol, one of three mansion-sized guest houses near the main castle. They said the extent of structural damage has not been determined.

"These people have the same mentality as those who killed Marcus Foster and kidnaped Patricia. They're nothing but a bunch of maniacs," said Randolph A. Hearst after he learned of the blast and rushed from the courtroom where his daughter is on trial on bank robbery charges.

Oakland Schools Supt. Marcus Foster was killed by the Symbionese Liberation Army, the same group that kidnaped Miss Hearst.

"It just shows the vicious, terrible

people that Patty was with. It's no wonder she was terrified of them," an angry and shaken Mrs. Hearst told reporters.

There was no immediate indication that the bombing at the Shangri-la of late publishing magnate William Randolph Hearst was connected with his granddaughter's trial.

Visitors to the estate, which became a state historical monument in 1958, were evacuated from all buildings and questioned by authorities

for possible clues to the blast.

Carrasco inmate given life sentence

AUSTIN — A jury has given Benito Alonzo, convicted of helping to arm prison inmate Fred Gomez Carrasco for a fatal escape attempt, a life sentence as a habitual criminal.

The 40-year-old San Antonio man, who has been to prison four times before, heard the finding Thursday without showing emotion. His attorneys have said they will appeal.

The same jury found Alonzo guilty Wednesday night of delivering to Huntsville the three pistols used by

drug kingpin Carrasco in an attempted escape on Aug. 3, 1974. Dist. Atty. Jerry Sandel of Huntsville said one of the weapons, a .357 magnum, was used by inmate Rodolfo Dominguez to kill hostage Julia Standley, a prison escapee.

Carrasco, Dominguez and hostage Elizabeth Beseda also were killed.

The jury of seven women and five men were given "prison packets" containing records of a burglary and two theft convictions. Jurors never were told that Alonzo also had a con-


viction for heroin possession. Alonzo was the second person to be convicted in connection with the escape attempt.

Ignacio Cuevas, one of Carrasco's two confederates in the attempted breakout, has been sentenced to death for capital murder.

Still to be tried are Lawrence Hall, the lifer who has admitted bringing the three pistols into the prison, and George "Skippy" Cisneros, who allegedly obtained the weapons in San Antonio.

Sandel of Huntsville sought to seek the death penalty for Cisneros, like Alonzo, for introducing firearms to the prison to facilitate an escape.

Nigeria coup 2nd in 7 months

NIAMEY, Nigeria — Broadcasts from Lagos today announced the second military coup in less than seven months in Nigeria.

A lieutenant colonel whose name could not be understood announced the overthrow of Brig. Murtala Muhammed. He said the government had been dissolved, travel was forbidden and a curfew from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. was ordered.

"We are all together," the broadcast said.
The South African radio also reported the coup but gave no details.

It was the fourth military coup in Nigeria, Africa's most populous nation and one of its richest in natural resources, since it got its independence from Britain in 1960.

Muhammed took over the government from Gen. Yakubu Gowon in a bloodless coup last July 29 while Gowon was attending a summit meeting of the Organization of African Unity in Kampala, Uganda.

Gowon himself came to power in a coup in July, 1966, six months after the military overthrew the civilian parliamentary government which the British left behind.

A Lagos broadcast monitored by

the British Foreign Office in London said the coup was the work of "young revolutionaries."

A Foreign Office spokesman said the coup occurred about 9:30 a.m. and reports were filtering in from the British High Commission in Lagos, the Nigerian capital. But the spokesman said the Foreign Office did not know yet whether there had been any violence or what conditions were like in Lagos.

Chinese hierarchy appears to ho struggle for position of premier

TOKYO — Acting Chinese Premier Hua Kuo-feng's two chief rivals — First Vice Premier Teng Hsiangping and Second Vice Premier Chang Chun-chiao — are expected to be given commanding positions in the Communist party and withdrawn from government administration, the Peking correspondent of the Kyodo news agency reported today.

The Japanese news agency's report said Hua was named acting premier by the 16-member party politburo, but the 149-member party central committee had not met yet to confirm or reject the appointment.

Hua appears to have the inside track for the premiership, but it seems likely that both Teng and Chang will make a fight for it unless the prospect of party seniority satisfies them, the report said.
There has been no indication when the central committee will meet.

China watchers were stunned last weekend by word from the Chinese capital that Teng, considered heir apparent to the late Premier Chou En-lai, had been passed over, and Hua, the minister of security and No. 11 in the party hierarchy, had become acting premier.

Speculation that a power struggle was under way was heightened today by telephone reports from Peking residents that dozens of posters have appeared on the walls of Peking University indirectly attacking the 71-year-old Teng. Such poster campaigns were one of the chief propaganda weapons of the radicals during the 1966-69 Great Cultural Revolution in which Teng was a casualty, and they often reflect the thinking of Chairman Mao Tse-tung.

The posters attacked "capitalist roaders," and resurrected a well-

known Teng quotation: "I care whether a cat is black or white as long as it catches mice."

Teng's observation on Chinese problems has been a means. But ideology over radical leftists led by Mao, Chiang Ching, and possibly Teng himself. In their view, it is important to uphold the cause than to improve the government and its policies.

Nothing has been heard since he delivered the funeral on Jan. 15 for Chou, his old mentor and mentor who died last year. Chou had groomed Teng for premiership since 1973, raised him from disgrace to him a member of the party's vice chairman of the party's army general staff.
