The 13th day of the trial ended emotion ally for the pale defendant Thursday as the government played for the jury a tape from the SLA featuring Miss Hearst saying she voluntarily joined her captors in the bank

The frail young woman wept when she heard the strident, angry voice of SLA chieftain Donald "Cinque" DeFreeze spew a cold, militaristic account of the bank rob-

Her shoulders shook visibly, and tears rolled down her face. She seemed to slightly regain her composure when a voice now identified as Harris railed about the news media and authorities fanning racism.

However, when her voice, soft but brimming with disdain, spoke as "Tania, a soldier in the people's army" she bowed her head and nervously rubbed her temple and lips.

Carter stared at the defendant when she referred to Weed on the tape as a "sexist, ageist pig" and then turned toward the recording machine again.

Her father, San Francisco Examiner president Randolph Hearst, stiffened when she called him "Adolf," presumably a reference to Adolf Hitler.

Her mother, Catherine, sat stone-faced, but the seven women and five men of the jury appeared enraptured as they followed her words with a government-prepared transcript.

'Maniacs' explode bomb in Hearst Cast

SAN SIMEON, Calif. — Patricia Hearst's parents blame "maniacs" for the \$1-million-plus bombing of an ornate guest house at the fabled Hearst Castle while their daughter is

There were no warning calls Thursday before the blast ripped through a building which 53 tourists had passed through just three minutes earlier, authorities said.

San Luis Obispo County sheriff's deputies said there were no arrests and no suspects. The FBI was inves tigating phone calls to two San Francisco radio stations claiming the New

World Liberation Front was respon-sible for the explosion here, 150 miles south of San Francisco.

The NWLF is a terrorist group that has claimed responsibility for numerous San Francisco Bay area bombings. Deputies said at least \$1 million

worth of treasures were damaged in charge the Casa del Sol, one of three mansion-sized guest houses near the main castle. They said the extent of structural damage has not been determined.

"These people have the same mentality as those who killed Marcus Foster and kidnaped Patricia. They're nothing but a bunch of man-they're nothing but a bunch of maniacs," said Randolph A. China watchers were stunned last weekend by word from the Chinese capital that Teng, considered heir apparent to the late Premier Chou En-lai, had been passed over, and Hua, the minister of security and No. 11 in the party hierarchy, had

become acting premier. Speculation that a power struggle was under way was heightened today by telephone reports from Peking residents that dozens of posters have appeared on the walls of Peking University indirectly attacking the 71year-old Teng. Such poster cam-paigns were one of the chief propaganda weapons of the radicals during the 1966-69 Great Cultural Revolution in which Teng was a casu-alty, and they often reflect the thinking of Chairman Mao Tse-Tung.
