> The \$2 charge for temporary permits was suggested as an attempt to stop students from using many temporary permits in place of a regular semester registration. The charge would be waived for those persons who use the temporary permit for a second car while their registered car is disabled.







Department of English as part of the Methodist University. He holds a entennial year. He is in residence for the spring semester.




