

Soviet Ambassador to review detente

M. Serebrjakov, second secretary to the Soviet Union's United Nations mission in New York, has been confirmed as Tuesday (March 30) speaker for International Week at Texas A&M.

The career diplomat will speak on "Soviet Interpretations of Detente," at 7:30 p.m. in Rudder Auditorium as part of a five-day observance sponsored by the International Students

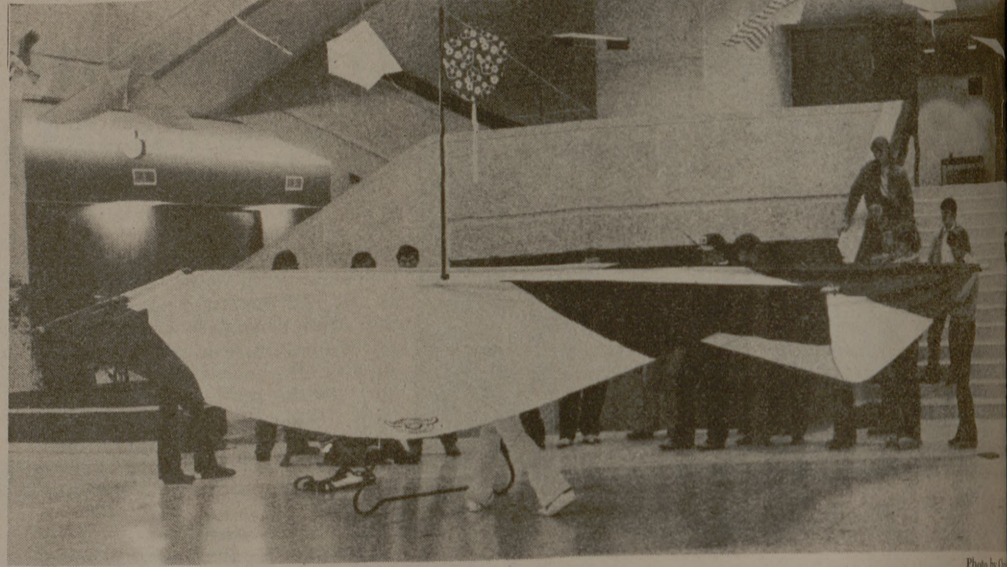
Association (ISA) at A&M. Texas A&M has approximately 1,000 international students from 75 countries.

A widely acclaimed foreign film on the Spanish Civil War, "To Die in Madrid," unfolds the week's activities at 8 p.m. Monday (March 29) in room 601 of Rudder Tower. Admission to the black-and-white movie is 50 cents.

Wednesday's (March 31) schedule includes the opening at 11 a.m. of cultural displays. Highlighting the day are a 6:30 p.m. banquet and an 8 p.m. talent show of cultural entertainment done in native costumes. All events are in the Memorial Student Center.

At 7:30 p.m. Thursday (April 1) the ISA is staging a roundtable discussion on "The World Speaks on Hunger," featuring at least 15 delegates from the Texas A&M foreign student body. The discussion is in Rudder Tower.

Friday's (April 2) program includes the 8 p.m. screening of the color documentary film, "One Fourth of Humanity," in Rudder Tower with admission of \$1 being charged.

A YEAR IN RESIDENCE MAY CONSIST OF THE FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS OR ONE OF THE ABOVE AND A FULL SUMMER SESSION (BOTH THE FIRST AND SECOND TERMS). THE HOURS PASSED AT THE PRELIMINARY GRADE REPORT PERIOD IN MARCH 1976 MAY BE USED IN SATISFYING THIS NINETY-TWO (92) HOUR REQUIREMENT. STUDENTS QUALIFYING UNDER THIS REGULATION SHOULD LEAVE THEIR NAMES WITH THE RING CLERK, ROOM SEVEN, RICHARD COKE BUILDING. THIS SHOULD BE DONE PRIOR TO MARCH 10TH IN ORDER FOR ALL RECORDS TO BE CHECKED TO DETERMINE RING ELIGIBILITY. 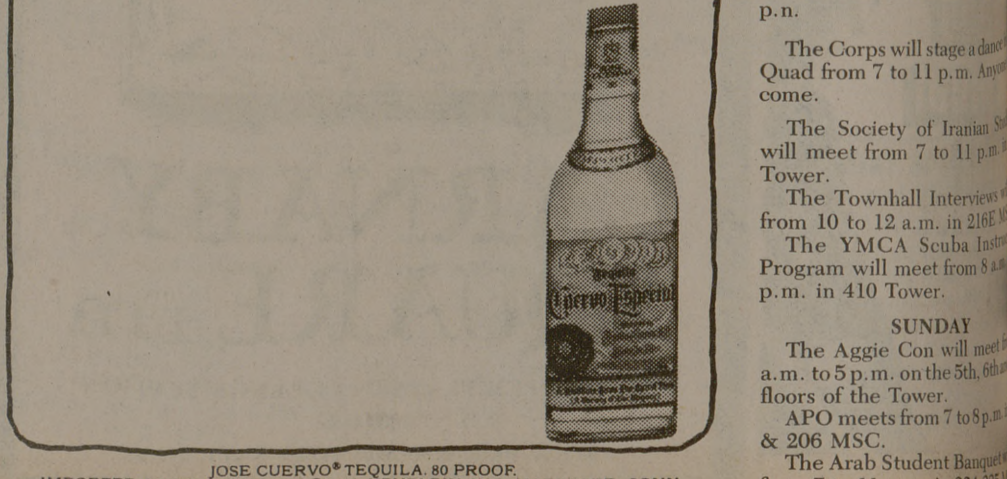
