### "Licked" is Mitchum's worst

## Grove movie not Oscar material

Robert Mitchum was right: "We've Never Been Licked" is the worst movie he ever made.

Mitchum played the tough-as-nails upperclassman, "Panhandle," in the classic A&M propaganda film shown last night in the Grove.

"Licked" is the story of Brad Craig (Richard Quinn), a young man following in his Aggie father's footsteps. Craig leaves the Far East, where his father, Gen. "Cannonball" Craig, is stationed and enrolls in A&M to study modern agricultural techniques; meets and falls in love with a popular campus beauty, whom his roommate, "Cyanide," loves; saves Cyanide's life in an heroic rescue; runs afoul of Panhandle constantly; breaks every Aggie rule and tradition possible; is promoted to Fish Sergeant and fights

one cadet after another; spends three years in the Corps until at last he can wear the vaunted Senior Boots; causes a fire in the building which he was guarding; gets involved in a plot to sell secret chemical formula to the Japanese during bonfire night; falls into disgrace and is expelled from the school just before Pearl Harbor; works for the Japanese as a sort of male Tokyo rose; prepares a treasonous speech from the air while observing Jap dive bombers leaving to attack the American fleet; encounters his old roommate, Cyanide, in the skies over the Pacific and leads him to the Japanese fleet; crash-lands his airplane on the deck of his aircraft carrier; and is posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor and becomes a hero in the best traditions of the Corps and God's America.

There are quite a few cute tricks to let one know who the Good Guys are. The Japanese cadets at A&M are confronted in a dorm room by angry Aggies and end up looking like bloodthirsty warmongers after making the statement that "everyone that dies (in the war in the Pacific) is contributing to the future greatness of Asia."

The battle scenes are a lesson in biomedicine. When shot, American aviators gasp and expire quietly. The

ungodly Nips spurt blood, and scream before going to Hades. Quotes like "The Aggies—bless us, every one," and "I believe an Aggie would ever give the country down" pepper the dialogue and keep anyone from getting a wrong idea about Texas A&M. By the time the movie is over, it is completely obvious why the place it is possible to see it on wooden benches in an outdoor theater that doesn't charge admission. Gig 'em, Aggies.

## Graduates face Friday deadline

Texas A&M University students who are completing their degree requirements and expect to graduate this summer have a Friday, July 16, deadline to make degree applications.

Robert A. Lacey, Texas A&M Registrar, said the degree application is a student responsibility.

To apply, students first pay an \$8

graduate fee at the Fiscal Office of the Richard Coke Building. Graduates then make formal application in room 7 of the Registrar's Office. Graduate students follow the same procedure in room 209, Graduate College Office.

Later degree application cause students a delay in getting certificates.

## A&M Dean elected to JETS Board of Directors

Dr. C. A. Rodenberger, assistant dean of engineering, was elected to the National Board of Directors of the Junior Engineering Technology Society (JETS), it was announced Wednesday.

His investment came during the meeting of the American Society for Engineering Education at Knoxville, Tenn. Texas currently has the largest JETS program in the nation with over 100 of the 131 chapters in this state.

Rodenberger credited his predecessor, Professor Emeritus John

McGuire, with building the program to its present status.

He also noted that the national organization has decided to initiate "knowledge competition," yearly at Texas A&M for Texas students, in all the other participating states.

"At the meeting we also decided to add another facet to the knowledge competition by instituting a new contest in team design. The groups would design engineering projects," Rodenberger said. The JETS annual conference is March 4, 1977.

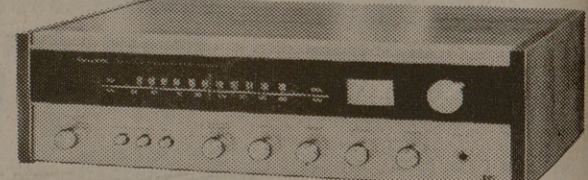

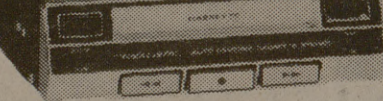

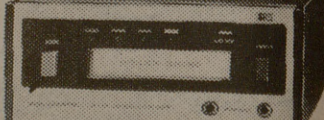
