## "Licked" is Mitchum's worst rove movie not Oscar mater

Robert Mitchum was right: "We've Never Been Licked" is the worst movie he ever made.

Mitchum played the tough-asnails upperclassman, "Panhandle," in the classic A&M propaganda film shown last night in the Grove.

"Licked" is the story of Brad Craig (Richard Quinn), a young man following in his Aggie father's footsteps. Craig leaves the Far East, where his father, Gen.
