

# History of Aggie uniform to be made into a boo

The man who brought you illustrated histories of the Aggie uniform last year is now working to complete

Walter H. Bradford of Vienna, Va., 1968 history graduate of Texas A&M University and former bandsman, is collecting information and memorabilia on uniforms for a volume he hopes will be published by fall in time for the final days of the Centennial Year observance.

His color illustrations and short histories have become known to


