Senate approves \$2.5 million for superport off Gulf Coast

Tuesday to spend \$2.5 million to continue state efforts to build a deepwater port for supertankers on the Texas coast.

The Senate also voted unanimously to ban use of trawls to catch redfish or speckled trout in coastal waters during Dec. 16-Jan. 28 to prevent overfishing of Gulf bays.

The emergency superport ap-propriation — which now goes to the House - is to be repaid if the project wins federal approval and the Texas Deepwater Port Authority is able to issue revenue bonds to raise \$1.2 billion to finance actual construction.

"Texas must have the capability of importing large quantities of oil," said Sen. A. R. Schwartz,
