# Millions laundered in Texas

DALLAS — Almost \$16 million was shuffled through a savings and loan in Laredo and an El Paso bank, federal authorities say.

Officials are calling it the largest known scheme to "launder" drug money through Texas in recent years.

Money laundering involves taking cash reaped from illicit activities and using it in a series of legal financial transactions to make it difficult to trace.

The Dallas Times Herald reported Sunday that investigators have found evidence that a prominent Mexican investment broker passed the money through Tesoro Savings and Loan in Laredo and the First City National Bank of El Paso.

Federal officials are trying to seize \$6.5 million on deposit at the El Paso bank and \$1.4 million at the Laredo savings and loan.

Agents also are seeking reimbursement of \$8 million that was hurriedly transferred out of the institutions after the Internal Revenue Service placed a claim on the Mexican businessman's funds, the Times Herald reported.

When federal drug agents raided two Anaheim, Calif., motels last June 22, they found \$4.1 million in alleged illicit drug trafficking proceeds that were about to be laundered through a California bank.

A few days later, an attorney representing the two suspects told prosecutors that the two were working for Mexican businessman Mardoqueo Alfaro Magarino, the Times Herald said.

DEA agents received information that Alfaro was involved with a Guadalajara-based drug trafficking ring, the newspaper added.

The IRS then placed levies on all U.S. assets in which Alfaro was believed to have an interest, the newspaper said.

However, Alfaro and his business associates managed to slip \$8 million out of the two Texas institutions, officials said.

Federal officials are trying to force the two Texas institutions to reimburse the government, since the money was released after the IRS had announced its claim on Alfaro's funds.

# CRIME STOPPERS

DALLAS — Cynthia Hynd McCray had dedicated her life to helping people, until the night of January 9, 1981.

Once described as a good, very professional nurse by police investigators, McCray is now a fugitive. She has eluded police since the January, 1981, murder of Buford Johnson, 42, of Dallas.

Police reports indicate that Johnson, a black male, died almost instantly from a gunshot wound in the face fired from pointblank range.

Detectives say McCray, who was a nurse at Children's Medical Center in Dallas at the time of the shooting, had been dating Johnson. On the evening of January 9, 1981, he had been at the Knight's Inn Tavern in the 500 block of Corinth Street in Dallas.

Apparently Johnson offered a woman at the bar a ride home. As the pair got into Johnson's vehicle, another car drove up.

A witness told investigators that McCray got out of the other vehicle and approached Johnson.

McCray is reported to have asked Johnson what he was doing. When Johnson replied that he was going to take the other woman home, a shot was fired and Johnson slumped down in the front seat of the car.

Investigators were told that McCray then fled the scene in the other automobile.

This week Cynthia Hynd McCray has made the Texas Most Wanted list. A \$1,000 reward is being offered for information leading to her capture.

McCray is described as a white male, 38 years old, 5 feet 5 inches, 115 pounds, with brown hair and green eyes.

Investigators believe she might be working as a nurse in State of Texas, possibly under a slight variation of her real name, the past she has used several aliases including Cynthia Louise Stone and Cynthia Louise Hynd.

In all cases, callers do not have to reveal their identities.

# State board investigating insurance agents in Texas

WACO — State insurance board officials have begun a sweeping investigation of insurance agents across Texas who may be selling bad policies from unlicensed firms, officials said.

The State Board of Insurance estimates that as many as 33,000 people in up to 30 states will be affected by its investigation into a kind of policy that "looks like insurance, smells like insurance, sounds like insurance, but there's nothing there," said

Commissioner Tom Bond.

The investigation is centered on about 20 agents considered to be the top sellers of medical coverage from eight Austin-based firms, said insurance board legal director Rebecca Motal.

The firms were unlicensed and unauthorized to sell insurance, the insurance board and Attorney General Jim Mattox have charged.

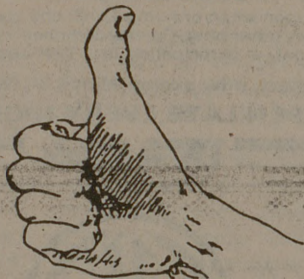
Most of the 20 agents under investigation are in the Houston and Austin areas where the unlicensed cov-

erage was widely marketed, Motal said, and eventually, the investigation will include "several hundred agents statewide."

"If we find somebody licensed in the state who negligently or knowingly sold somebody something insurance when it wasn't, we have reason to have action against them," Bond said.

The State Insurance Board has gotten more than 500 complaints of unpaid claims totaling \$8.5 million against the firms.
