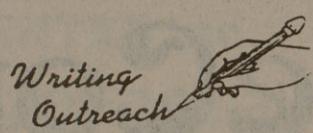

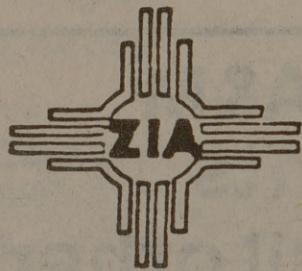

A&M set for Toto concert Thursday

As part of its "Isolation Tour," the musical group Toto will perform Thursday night in G. Rollie White Coliseum at 8 p.m. The opening act for Toto is John Parr.

Town Hall and Budweiser are sponsoring the performance of the six-time Grammy award-winning group. This is the first concert tour for Toto in almost three years.

The "Isolation Tour" will take the group through the southern portions of the United States concentrating on Texas, Oklahoma, Florida and Louisiana.

Since the release of the Toto IV album, which brought the group its six Grammys, Toto has been dedicated to producing its latest album — "Isolation."

The group also took on two other major projects before starting the tour.

In late 1983, Toto wrote music for the movie "Dune." The group also composed the music for the band events at the 1984 Summer Olympics. "Moodido" was written, recorded and mixed in a matter of days and was featured throughout the games.

Toto also has gone through some personnel changes. When Bob Kimball decided to leave the group, he was replaced by Fergie Fredericson, formerly of Laroux.

The "Isolation Tour" marks the first time a musical group has worked with a major brewing company to support a non-profit organization. A portion of the proceeds from the entire tour will be donated to the United Service Organization.

Tickets for the concert are on sale at the Memorial Student Center Box Office or from any Town Hall member. Prices are \$8.50 for general admission and \$10 for reserved seats.

Congressional scholar to hold seminar here

The president of the American Political Science Association, who is an internationally recognized congressional scholar, will visit Texas A&M today.

At the invitation of the political science department, Dr. Richard F. Fenno, Jr. will conduct a graduate research seminar at 4 p.m. in Evans Library 204C.

Fenno, the Kenan Professor of Political Science and Distinguished Professor of Arts and Sciences at the University of Rochester, is the author or editor of six books, including three studies of the U.S. Congress.

One of the studies brought Fenno the Woodrow Wilson Foundation Award for the best book on political science published in the United States in 1978. The same book also won the Hardeman Prize from the Lyndon B. Johnson Library for the best book on Congress published between 1976 and 1978.

Fenno also has written more than 15 other articles about Congress and the president.
