Running nightclub isn't just one big party, boss says

One might think working at a nightclub would be an easy job — seeing friends and listening to music all night.

But Jack Bryant, the manager of Graham Central Station in Bryan, says it isn't true. He explains that a lot of time and effort go into operating a nightclub.

Bryant, a big man wearing a black cowboy hat, said he has worked at the local club for almost three years. Before he worked here, Bryant said he worked at a club with the same name in Oklahoma City.

But Bryant has not always managed nightclubs. He said he had his own oilfield vacuum truck business in Oklahoma that he and his wife started.

Bryant decided to pursue a new career when the industry began to decline.

"The oilfield went bad in Oklahoma and I sold out while I could get out," he said.

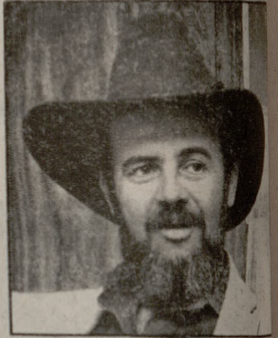
After a year's vacation in Florida, he was offered the Oklahoma City manager's job.

"It's not like working," Bryant said. "It's something different every night."

Kyle Clark, a bar manager at the club, said Bryant is a fair and patient man.

"I cannot think of anything bad about Jack," he said.

Bryant, who has seen students in the Bryan-College Station area for two years, says, "The kids in this town are better than the ones where I grew up."

Bryant says he likes Aggies. "They are better mannered, easier to get along with," he said, "and his patrons and his employees are his basis. He added they were easy to work with and talk to."

Bryant said he is not sure if he just Aggies who are better mannered or kids in general.

"My kids (a boy, 20, and a girl, 17) are better than I was when I was a kid," he said.

"But they're both in Oklahoma now, which makes me sad," he said as he stroked his full beard.

Bryant said he is not sure if he stays in the nightclub business, but said his daughter may come to A&M, and, if so, he will see Bryant at least until she is in college. Bryant says he does not know what he plans to do after now.

"But I definitely like working like this more than an 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. job," he said.

"It gets in your blood and it's getting better and better."

Texaco investors force stay in stock trading

NEW YORK — A wave of selling by investors worried about the future of Texaco Inc. knocked down its stock Tuesday and forced trading of the stock to be temporarily suspended on the New York Stock Exchange.

The selloff was triggered by comments by Texaco's president that the company could not post a \$12 billion bond that might be required to appeal a \$10.53 billion damage verdict won last week by Pennzoil Co. He also said one outcome of that might be to force Texaco into reorganization proceedings under federal bankruptcy laws.

But outside analysts and Texaco officials questioned whether the bond would ever be needed.

The remarks attributed to Texaco President Alfred C. DeCrane Jr. by a Dallas newspaper sent Texaco's stock skidding \$1.75 a share to \$32.50 in early, heavy trading on the NYSE. An imbalance in buy and sell

orders then led the exchange to suspend trading for 59 minutes. Texaco shares resumed trading at \$32.75, then lost some more ground to finish the day at \$32, down 4 percent from Monday.

DeCrane was in Dallas to tell news media people about his decision by a Houston jury that Texaco improperly gained control of Getty Oil Co. by breaking a merger agreement between Pennzoil and Pennzoil. The jury said Texaco must pay Pennzoil \$10.53 billion in actual and punitive damages.

Texas law requires defendants to post a bond equal to an award of attorneys' fees and interest on a judgment. The bond was posted either in cash or liquid assets.

Lawyers for both sides are expected before state District Judge Tom Casseb Jr. in Houston today to argue whether he should uphold the jury's verdict and award

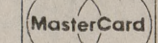
