







energy trading company. The financial debacle touched more than half members of Congress accepted campaign contributions from the energy company, as well as top members of the Bush administration who were contacted by Enron it teetered toward bankruptcy.

In opening statements at a House hearing, lawmakers denounced the rushed shredding at Andersen as the business practices that Enron's failure.

Andersen senior partner Dorsey Baskin and partner Andrew Andrews, appearing as named witnesses with the repeatedly pinned the blame on Duncan, whom Andersen fired last week. Andersen has been fired by Enron's accounting firm.

"This effort was undertaken without any consultation with others in the firm or, so far as we are aware, with legal counsel," Baskin said of the shredding.

Andrews insisted that Duncan, as Andersen's partner for Enron, was solely responsible for preserving documents.

Duncan was the first to speak but did not speak at the hearing other than to assert his Amendment right against self-incriminating himself.

"Enron robbed the Arthur Andersen provided a getaway car and they were at the wheel," Rep. Greenwood, R-Pa., told the hearing.

When Greenwood began questioning Duncan, asking if he had given an order to destroy documents to a governmental investigation, Duncan cited his constitutional right to silence.

Duncan invoked the Fifth Amendment amid the banks of cameras. "Respectfully, that will be my response to all your questions," he told the panel. He was questioned further and excused.

Afterward, Greenwood said "I still haven't made my mind on whether Mr. Duncan was a rogue employee or whether Mr. Duncan was a scapegoat."

Senate Majority Leader Daschle said Duncan should be compelled to testify.




