DETROIT (AP) - Toyota Camry was the most stolen vehicle model for the fifth-straight year on an annual list that monitors trends in auto theft.

Overall, vehicle thefts fell 2.7 percent last year, according to Chicagobased CCC Information Services Inc., an insurance industry tracker of trends in theft and vehicle damage.

Not surprisingly, the most stolen cars were the perennial sales leaders. Nineteen of the 25 moststolen cars on the list were Toyota Camrys and Honda Accords or Civics of different years.
