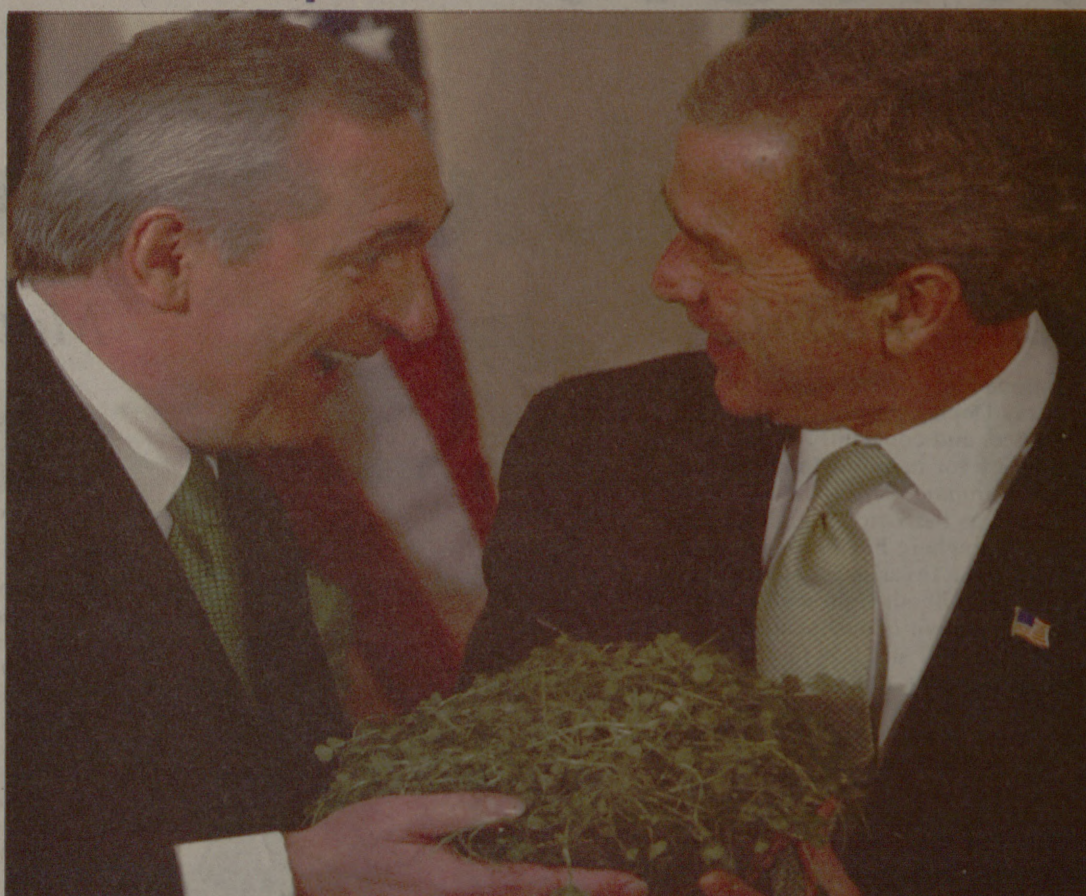

Camry most-stolen for fifth-straight year

DETROIT (AP) — Toyota Camry was the most stolen vehicle model for the fifth-straight year on an annual list that monitors trends in auto theft.

Overall, vehicle thefts fell 2.7 percent last year, according to Chicago-based CCC Information Services Inc., an insurance industry tracker of trends in theft and vehicle damage.

Not surprisingly, the most stolen cars were the perennial sales leaders. Nineteen of the 25 most-stolen cars on the list were Toyota Camrys and Honda Accords or Civics of different years.

of the College Station campus the fourth-longest term in history of A&M presidents.

Bowen announced his resignation in June 2001. Bowen was in several lawsuits filed by and family members of a man killed in the 1999 Aggie football collapse, who claim he and administrators knew the tradition was dangerous and have prevented the tragedy.

There is speculation retiring U.S. Sen. Phil Gramm-Texas, will take Bowen's place, but committee members and regents have not confirmed or denied rumors about potential candidates.

Erle Nye, chairperson of the Board of Regents, said he has not tried to influence the search committee's task, which is in its ninth month.

The Board of Regents is not bound by the committee's recommendations, will select a replacement for Bowen, became president in 1994.

The new president will face a list of challenges, including A&M's struggles with enrollment shortfalls and enrollment. He or she will face issues of demographics, fund raising and legislative dealings as Texas continues to strive to become a top public university.
