Big Event has changed from past years. The biggest change this year was the increase in the number of students who participated, McAlpine said.

Big Event began in 1982 when six Aggies planned to clean a local cemetery. Big Event has always been a way for Aggies to thank the Bryan-College Station community each year, McAlpine said.

"[Big Event] is a thank you to the entire community that supports A&M, not just lower-level income areas," McAlpine said.

Students and student organizations are recruited to work on all of the community projects planned for the day. A computer program randomly assigns students and organizations to service sites.

'We will not turn anyone down unless [the service event] is an unsafe environment," said Allison Qualls, assistant director of Big Event.

McAlpine and Qualls said the entire community is grateful and thanks all the students who participated in Big Event.

Big Event has evolved into the largest single-day, studentrun service project in the country. At last count, almost 40 colleges and universities across the U.S. have created their own version of Texas A&M's Big Event.
