General Order No. 26.

1. Hereafter the detail of cadets for marking at the target range (pulling targets) will be made by roster from the companies. Regiments will alternate weekly in furnishing those details. The detail will consist of: one non-commissioned officer (designated by the Sgt. Major) and 1 cadet from each company, designated by the captain of the organization, who will send in, with the morning report, the name of the cadet detailed for that day.
2. In this connection, care will be observed that the cadet so detailed will have vacant periods for the time required on the

range. A cadet may be detailed for part of the afternoon and relieved by another cadet from the same company.

3. The 1st Regt. will furnish the detail for the week ending Nov. 11, 1916.
