Rifles and equipment will be turned in to the armory as follows

2nd Regt. after dinner, Thursday, December 21st, in the following order:

Co's E, F, G, H, at room 315.

Co's A, B, C, D, at room 316.

The band will turn in their instruments and equipment at noon Thursday, December 21st.

No cadet will be excused from the above formation for any reason whatsoever.

Each cadet will place his name and company (on a piece of paper) under the sight leaf of the rifle and in the cartridge box. Rifles will be cleaned and oiled before turning them in. Oil for this purpose may be obtained by the Captains of companies at noon December 20th at the armory.

Captains of companies will prepare a list showing the name of every cadet and No. of rifle in their organization, and will accurately check each cadet when he turns in his arms and equipment. This list will be turned over to Sergeant Hyland.

No cadet, on the campus or otherwise, will be allowed to keep arms and equipment in their possession during the holidays.
