
Dr. Hedges' Book Reviewed.

In the Journal of the American Chemical Society for January, Arthur W. Dox, head of the Research Work of the Ames, Iowa, Experiment Station, gives a praiseworthy review of "A Laboratory Manual of Agricultural Chemistry" by Charles Cleveland Hedges, Ph. D., Professor of Chemistry, and William Thoreau Bryant, B. S. Ch. E., Instructor, in the A. and M. College of Texas.

In closing his review of the contents, Dr. Dox says, "Most of the experiments are followed by a series of questions designed to stimulate thought on the part of the student. A valuable feature of the book is the frequent citation of references to published literature, too often
