Unless there are seven or more adverse votes at such meeting the applicant shall be declared a member.

- Art. 4. The membership shall be divided in two classes known as degrees—the privileges shall be the same, except that no member shall be entitled to hold an office in the Fraternity until he shall have taken the second degree.
- Art. 5. In addition to the above there shall be an honorary membership known as the "Veterans." The membership in this shall be limited to twenty-five and shall never exceed that number. To this, only such excadets as have attained prominence through their own efforts and are entitled to recognition by their fellow members, shall be eligible, and no one shall be eligible until he has been away from college five years or more. Members may be nominated for this honor only at their annual meetings and to be elected shall receive the votes of three-fourths of the members present, and there shall be not more than five persons elected to this honor in any one meeting.

## SECTION III.

- Art. 1. The business meeting of the Fraternity and its transactions shall be secret.
- Art. 2. The ceremonies of initiation of members, etc., shall be prescribed by the committee on work at the meeting wherein this constitution is adopted and shall be secret.

## SECTION IV.

Art. 1. The officers of this fraternity shall be as follows:
