

## In Memoriam.

DIED.—In Waco, Texas, November 15th, after seven weeks' illness, Geo. L. Brazelton, in the seventeenth year of his age.

On Sept. 30th, after returning from a days' hunt, Geo. Brazelton was taken sick with pneumonia, and for nearly three weeks he struggled with disease like one fighting for his life. He was successful, and recovered his health and strength sufficiently to go home with his parents to Waco from the College. A few days after his return to his home, he was stricken down with a relapse, from which he never recovered.

George Brazelton was a young man of marked characteristics. He was generous to a fault, open-hearted, and had that innate love for his friends that made him popular. He was studious and attentive to his duties, as the record of his last years' cadetship shows. Coming back to College with a zeal animated by his advancement to a higher class, he was maintaining his record for good scholarship when overtaken by the dread disease which ended his life; therefore be it
