

Bryan, Texas, Nov. 8.—Referee, Lamar Bethea; umpire, Johnson; timekeepers, Love and Westerfield; linemen, Woods and Atkins.

The game was the most brilliant played in Texas this season, quick and full of action from the start and heartily enjoyed by the spectators. Agricultural and Mechanical was victorious, the score standing 17 to 5. The advantage of weight was on the side of Agricultural and Mechanical and was used in rushing center all the way through. The halves were twenty-five and twenty minutes.

Tulane won the toss and chose the east goal. Deware kicked off to 20-yard line, ball returned ten yards by Tulane, Tulane's ball and gained five yards. Tulane kicked twenty yards and ball was captured by Agricultural and Mechanical and entire distance regained. After five brilliant plays by Agricultural and Mechanical, Hope made the first touchdown and Deware then kicked goal. Time 7 minutes.

Tulane again kicked to Agricultural and Mechanical's yard line and the ball was taken in charge by Agricultural and Mechanical. Agricultural and Mechanical then fought through center for twenty-three downs in which some fine work was done by Blake, Hope, Neff, Deware, Benjamin and Beilharz when the second touchdown was scored by Neff for the A. & M. Deware kicked goal. Time 10½ minutes from first touchdown.

Tulane made a long kick to A. & M.'s 5-yard line when A. & M. took the ball and forced their opponents back and the first half ended with the ball on Tulane's 10-yard line. In the entire first half Tulane

got possession of the ball but once.

The second half opened with a kick-off by Tulane to A. & M.'s 35-yard line. Hope for A. & M. caught the ball and made a 10-yard run. The A. & M. gradually worked back across the field and Neff scored a touchdown. Deware failed for goal. Tulane again kicked off and, after one or two downs, secured the ball for the second time.

The visitors then made several quick and decisive plays, ending with a beautiful kick by fullback, putting the ball straight over goal and scoring five points. During the remainder of the second half the A. & M. kept the ball in Tulane territory, and time was called with the ball on Tulane's 6-yard line.

None of the players were seriously hurt and no substitutes were put in. The Tulane manager complimented the A. & M. boys by saying emphatically they had the best team in the South.
