THE CIVIL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT.

It would appear that the Civil Engineering Department has been somewhat slighted here in the way of material improvements. It is now the only Department of the College that has no separate building.

The class and instrument rooms were formerly in the Gathright hall, but were moved last session to the old Chemistry Department in the main building. This department consists of three large rooms, and two small office rooms. In addition to the surveying instruments, the department has testing machines of various kinds, and many other devices used in Civil Engineering. Yet the course is still far from being well equipped. It has not been given the financial support the other courses have received, although the prospects are good for the future. Last year the Legislature passed a bill appropriating \$25,000 for the erection of a Civil Engineering building, but the Governor vetoed it. The increased number of students and the necessary enlargement of the course, demand its early erection.

Yet brick and mortar, wood and steel do not make a Civil Engineering course, whatever form they may be in.
