INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS.

College Station, Texas, Sept. '05.
—Upon arriving at the College all
students should proceed at once to
the office of the Reception Com-
mittee, room 8 Main Building,
where they will register and re-
ceive free meal tickets. No stu-
dent will be admitted to the Mess
Hall without a meal ticket. New
students arriving on night trains
will be assigned furnished rooms
for that night by the Reception
Committee.

All students are required to ma-
triculate as soon as possible after
their arrival.

HOW TO MATRICULATE.

1. Go to the Commandant's of-
fice, room 2, for assignment to
room and company.

2. Make the deposit for fees and
uniform with the Treasurer, room
20. In case of failure to enter Col-
lege the amount will be refunded.

3. Obtain an "Information Card"
at the Secretary's office, room 19.
Fill it out and take it to the Pres-
ident, room 16, who will give in
exchange an "Examination Per-
mit." (See schedule of examina-
tions below.)

4. After passing entrance ex-
aminations students will return to
the President for their signed "In-
formation Cards" and take same
to the Secretary's office, room 19,
where they will receive a "Regis-
tration Certificate." Old students
will not receive "Examination Per-
mit," but will return the signed
"Information Card" direct to the
Secretary.

and procure text-books.

The reception committee will
cheerfully answer all inquiries.

Trunks will be hauled from the
station to the barracks free of
charge.

Money and valuables should be
deposited with the Treasurer,

be obtained at regular contract
prices, room 2.

Have measure taken for a uni-
form in room 2.

Consult frequently the bulletin
boards on first floor of Main Build-
ing.
