H. Brinkmann, '06 and '07, is with the General Electric Company, 12 Barrett, St., Schenectady, N. Y.

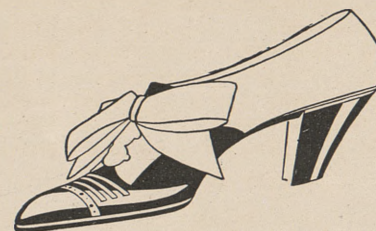

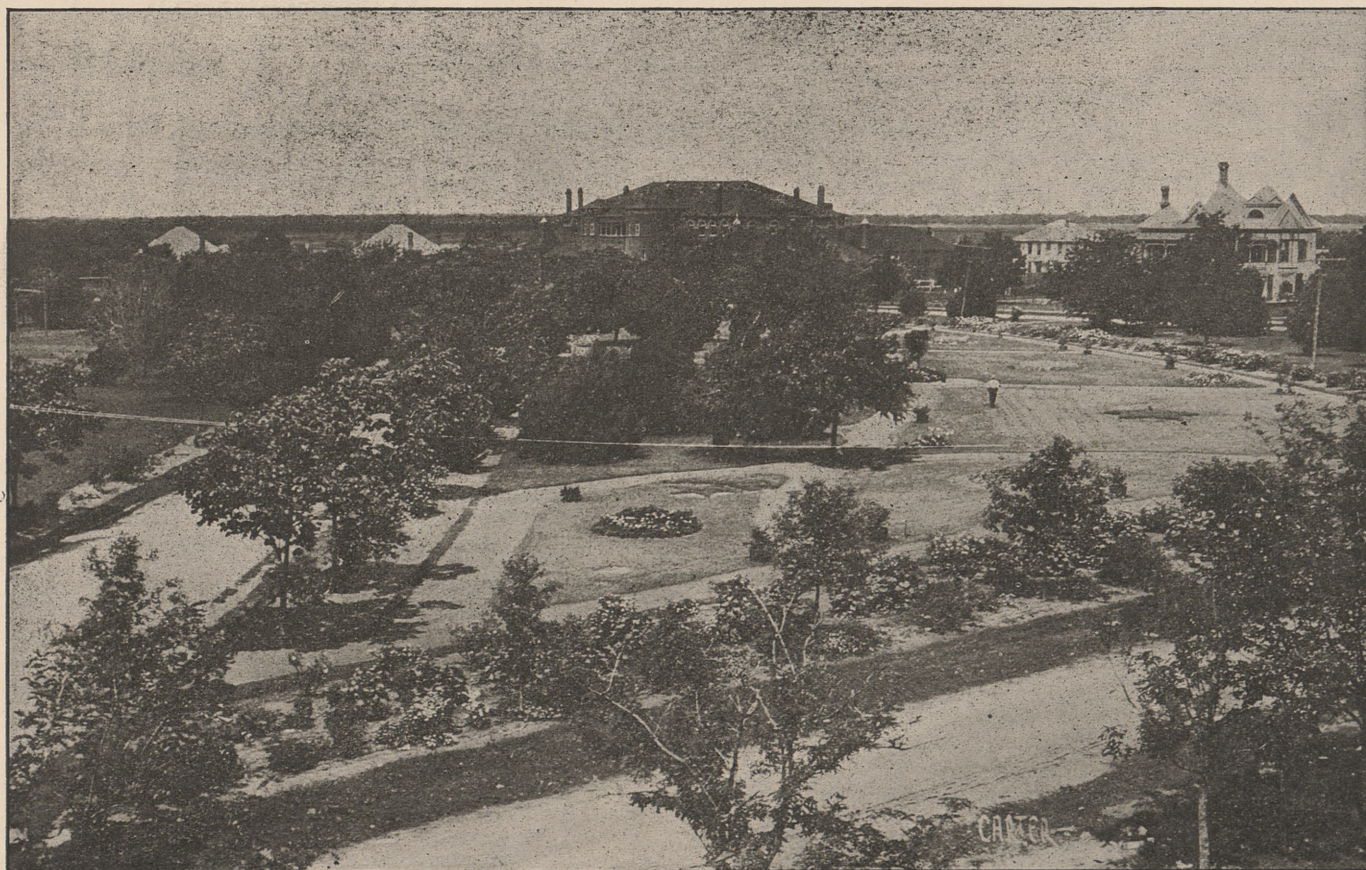
