First down—Moore fumbled, but recovered. Lost two yards. Second—Russell went through right tackle for seven yards. Third—Kirkpatrick tried a long forward pass, which was fumbled, after being thrown, but recovered by Estill on A. & M.'s fifteen-yard line.

First down—Russell went through left tackle for one yard. Second—Brown through left tackle for one yard. Third down—Kirkpatrick tried a place kick, but failed. A. & M. put the ball in play on their twenty-yard line.

First down—Beasley went through left end for nine yards. Second—Bateman went through center one yard. First down—Beasley went through left end for five yards. A. & M. was penalized fifteen yards, placing the ball on their twenty-seven yard line.

First down—Whyte kicked to University's fifty-yard line. First down—Russell returned the ball eighteen yards. First down—Moore tried a center play, but fumbled the ball. Ward of A. & M. recovered it on A. & M.'s thirty-six yard line. First down—Whyte on a fake play made eight yards through left end. 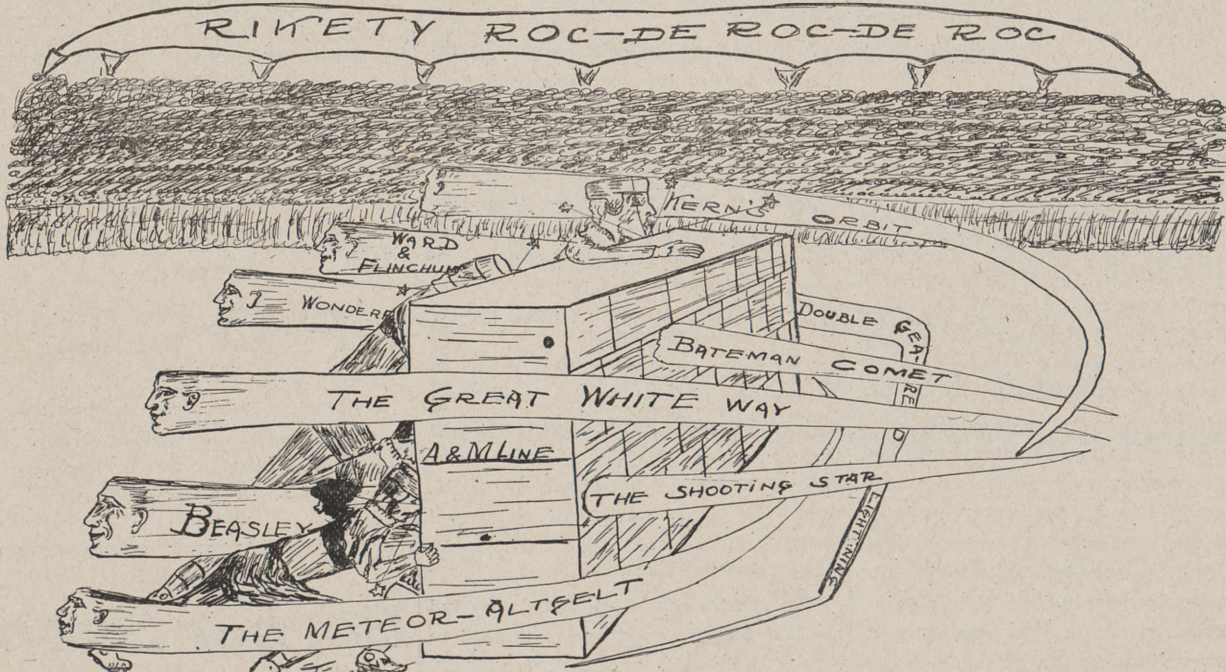
