Beasley hits line for seven-yard gain. Texas penalized five yards for off-siding. Whyte punted thirty-seven yards to Snipes, who fumbled. Keene recovered in a free-for-all scramble. Headrick kicked thirty-five yards to Bateman, who returned twenty yards. Kearns bucked line for two-yard gain. Kearns hit line for no gain. Bateman attempted forward pass to Flinchum; ball went off field and forfeited to S. W. U. Headrick punted forty-two yards to Kearns, who returned twelve yards. S. W. U. penalized five yards for off-siding. Barnes lost two yards on line rush. Bateman advanced four yards around left end. Whyte kicked thirty-nine yards to McHenry, who returned ten yards. Texas blocked Headrick's punt. Beasley recovered ball and advanced five yards. Bateman hit line for no gain. Whyte through line three yards. Texas penalized fifteen yards on ten-yard line for side-line talking. Whyte punted twenty yards to Snipes, who returned thirty yards through broken field. McHenry failed to gain around right end. Mikel through line four yards. Headrick punted thirty-one yards to Kearns, who was downed in his tracks. Barnes gained ten yards through line. Beasley scuttled line for twelve yards. Bateman hit line for no gain. Whyte punted twenty-five yards to Snipes, who fumbled. Brownfield recovered.

Whyte made spectacular forward pass from twenty-five yard line to Kearns, who carried the ball five yards for the only touch-down. Flinchum kicked goal. Cretcher relieved Hohn and Underwood, Bateman. Keene kicked off to Cretcher, who received on ninety-yard line. Underwood gains four yards through line. Underwood three yards through line. Underwood hit line for five yards. Bell six yards through line. Bell three yards over line. Kearns seven yards through line. Underwood bucked line for gain of four yards. Whyte around left end two yards. Whyte punted forty-five yards to McHenry, who was downed in his tracks. Headrick punted thirty yards to Kearns, who advanced twenty-five yards, or to S. W. U.'s fifteen-yard line. Time called.
