Advisory System at Cornell.

The faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences at Cornell University has adopted a system of advisers for underclassmen. For some years there has been in operation a system of upperclass advisers, which provided that at the beginning of the Junior year students must choose as an adviser a proféssor or assistant professors to take the major portion of his upperclass work. The new plan has heen originated in response to the belief that it would be advisable to give more systematic assistance to Freshmen and Sophomores in such matters as choice of studies and arrangement of courses.

Hereafter every underclassman must choose, or will have assigned to him, some member of the faculty to whom he may go for advice in the selection of his studies. It is the duty of the adviser to establish friendly relations with the students in his charge and make them feel that he will be glad to confer with them on other subjects than the choice of studies. And, as with the present system of upperclass advisers, the underclassman's study card must be approved and signed by his adviser before it will be accepted at the dean's office. No one adviser will have more than ten underclassmen under his charge.-New York Evening Post.
