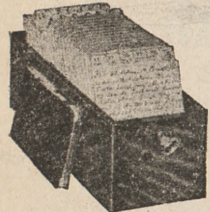


MEMINDEX

AGRICULTURAL NOTES.

The following men from the Extension department were in attendance at the Waco Cotton Palace, November 2-17: Superintendent C. M. Evans, H. H. Williamson, who has charge of the boys' and girls' club work in Texas; O. H. Sellers, in charge of correspondence courses; R. R. Rosa, in charge of fair exhibits, who was assisted by B. R. Kennedy. All of these men delivered speeches at the exhibit hall during the Cotton Peace and report that great interest was shown by the visitors in this exhibit. This exhibit is in charge of Mr. Rosa, and was first shown at the Dallas State Fair, where it also attracted considerable interest and favorable comment.

The intention in presenting to the public this exhibit, states Superintendent Evans, is to bring to the at-

tention of the people of Texas exactly the kind of work that the A. and M. College is doing, what the students are taught to do, and the kind of information that the college is trying to give to the farmers of Texas, and not to show large yields, freak farm products, etc.

Some of the most important parts of this exhibit consist of the following:

Good road exhibit prepared by the Highway Engineering department.

An exhibit from the Veterinary department showing specimens of the different diseases to which the livestock of Texas is subject.

An exhibit from the Horticultural department showing the different varieties of pecans, the different methods of budding and grafting, and methods of tree surgery.

An exhibit from the Animal Husbandry department showing the best methods of feeding animals, balanced rations, hog houses, etc.

An exhibit from the Textile department showing cloth manufactured by students of the department.

An exhibit from the Mechanical Engineering department showing an exhibit of the work done by the students in the manual training department.

An exhibit from the Dairy department showing the forms of silos and method of testing milk by the Babcock tester, etc.

An exhibit from the Agronomy department showing different farm products, etc.

Boys and girls' club demonstration work.

From Waco this exhibit will be carried to Beaumont, where it will be shown at the Southeast Texas Fair.
