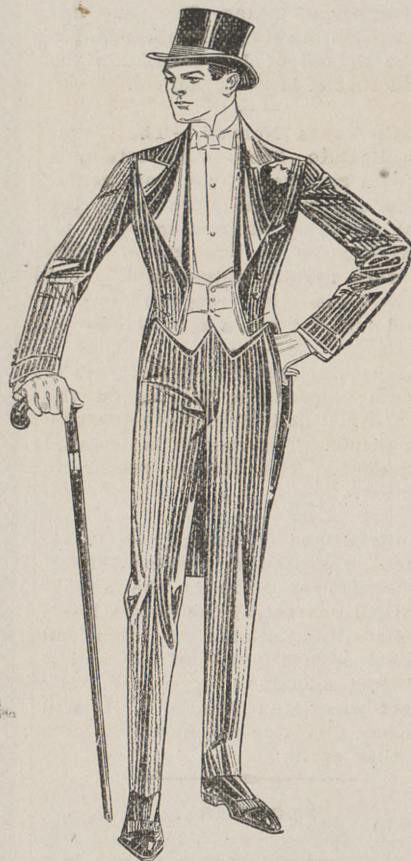

The following two letters have been handed the Battalion for publication: College Station, Tex., April 7, 1915. Prof. Chas. Puryear, Dean of the College, Campus.

Dear Sir:

Last summer I announced to the cadet corps that I would pay the expenses (up to \$100.00) to the Panama Exposition in San Francisco of the student making the highest term grade during this session. With your per-

mission, I also announced at the time that you would give me the name of this student as soon as practicable after the close of school.

In view of the fact that there seems to be some misunderstanding as to whether this offer holds good if the corps does not go to the Exposition as was contemplated, and also the rules governing the contest, I wish to advise that the offer will be extended whether the corps makes the trip or not, and that no formal rules have been decided upon.

I would deem it a favor if you would formulate the rules governing this contest and announce them to the cadet corps.

Dear Sir:

I shall be very glad to comply with your request that I report to you as soon as possible after the close of the current session the name of the student whose class standing is highest. The prize which you are offering will, I am sure, have a stimulating effect. I give below the rules which will govern the contest:

1. In order to be eligible, a student must have taken, in each term, as many hours of work as are required in his class and course; and all his grades must have been A, B, or P.

2. Class standing will be determined as follows:

To the grades mentioned above the following values will be assigned: A, 95; B, 85; P, 84.

Each term-subject will be given a weight equal to the number of term-hours assigned to it in the curricula, theory and practice being counted separately.

The value of each grade for a given student will be multiplied by the weight of the corresponding subject; the sum of these products will be divided by the sum of the weights; the
