HORTICULTURAL DEPARTMENT
OF THE AGRICULTURAL AND
MECHANICAL COLLEGE
OF TEXAS

The purpose of the Horticultural Department is to develop, for the profession of Horticulture, leaders, such as Specialists in Experiment Station or Research work, teachers of Horticulture in high schools and colleges, specialists in the Extension Service, specialists in the State and Federal Departments of Agriculture, and practical fruit and vegetable growers.

In order to properly prepare the student so that he may accomplish the greatest possible results in this profession, he is given, during his Freshman and Sophomore years, a thorough grounding in English and in the fundamental sciences of Chemistry, Geology and Entomology. In his Junior and Senior years, he devotes most of his time to the applied sciences, to Rural Economics and Rural Sociology, and to technical work in Agronomy and Horticulture. The technical work in Horticulture includes courses in Plant Propagation, Vegetable Gardening, Fruit Growing, Nut Culture, Plant Breeding, Viticulture, Spraying, Pomology, Citrus Fruits, Experimental Horticulture, and marketing of Horticultural products; besides special work in Landscape Art and Floriculture. In order to develop the practical side of the student, he is given practice work in the Horticultural orchards, which contain the standard varieties of peaches, pecans, grapes, persimmons, pears, plums, figs and small fruits, consisting of blackberries and dewberries. Where the student is anxious to receive still further practical experience, he is assisted in securing summer work in the fruit growing sections of Texas, Arkansas,

Colorado, Michigan and other fruit states.

The graduates from the Horticultural Department, who have desired positions, have found ready employment in the State Department of Agriculture, the Extension Service, the Federal Department of Agriculture, and as managers of fruit and vegetable farms.
