Championship team of 1917, over half were from the 1920 Class—a record that has been surpassed by no class before or since that time.

In 1918 basketball, the Fish of the year before were the most promising material, stepping into the places vacated by men like Griesenbeck, Settegast, and Gillilan, and filling them worthily. As in football, the Class of 1920 furnished the majority of the team including Longcope, Wise, Gouger, and McQuillen, all of whom received letters.

It was not until last year that the baseball men of the 1920 Class were given an opportunity to show what they could do, but when it did come they were quick to take advantage of it. Lewis covered third with such clean fielding and straight throwing that it set every cadet's mind at rest to see a ball go his way, in the outfield Glezen and Wise handled all the high ones, while as trusty slugger, all three put fear into the hearts of many an opposing pitcher.

When the 1918 football season began, many of the men of the 1917 team were in the Service. But although the Junior Class was unable to furnish its usual quota, it made up by supplying a captain in Alexander and two other men of quality, Harrison and Drake.

The excellent basketball team which represented the College in 1919 owed to the Junior Class Captain Longcope and McQuillen, forward, who will lead next year's team—two of the fastest, cleanest basketball men who have ever played a game before the cadet corps.

The Junior Class had one representative in track and three in baseball this year. Alexander put the shot and threw the javelin with a mighty arm, while in baseball, Powell showed his ability behind the bat and Lewis held down his old position at third with an ease that marks him as a natural ball player, and has won him the captaincy of next year's team, while "Red" Lackey performed with credit in the infield and was one of our most dangerous hitters.

The athletic outlook for next year is good and there is no doubt that in all fields the Class of 1920 will be as fully represented as in its illustrious past.

The stucco building facing the Interurbane line, built originally as a Officer's Quarters and transferred to a Community Home for many of the young ladies employed on the campus, has been finally decided upon as a dormitory for the girls and young women who will attend the summer school at college. This is a very attractive, modern building of 34 splendid rooms. If the young ladies in question do not care for it we offer the suggestion that cadets be quartered there!

The removal of many of the small unsightly buildings and the erection of the various large modern structures will add considerably to the beauty of the campus as well as to the convenience and efficiency of the plant.
