R. O. T. C. NOTES

Transfer of Capt. Jenkins and Capt. Dunkum

Orders were received recently by Colonel Muller, head of the R. O. T. C. unit here, authorizing the transfer of Capts. Jenkins and Dunkum to Camp Travis, Texas. These men have been connected with the College for the past six or seven months and were very efficient officers.

Captain Albert L. Tuttle, recently assigned to the infantry R. O. T. C. unit at this College, has arrived and assumed his new duties. He is assistant professor of military science and tactics and instructor in infantry.

The war department recently authorized the formation of a cavalry unit at this institution, and applications are now being made for that branch by the cadets. The hours of instruction are the same in all branches of the R. O. T. C. The question of organization has not yet been determined and will be determined by the number of students desiring to enter this unit. The cavalry unit will be maintained in one of two ways: namely, without separation as an independent organization but in connection with the infantry, having certain cavalry instructions and parts of the infantry instructions; and the second way it may be organized into a separate unit, having its own organization and following its own course of instruction.
