The Committee has established only a few regulations which hes been approved by the President and which are published below

1. The Written consent to
funds will be issued in triplicate on a printed form, by the Chairman of tha Committee on Sturent Activities. The riginal will be given to the student Chairman and the triplicate be file Chatman and the triplicate be file will specify the purpose for which will specify the purpose for which state the approximate amount to be

Funds for all major studen ativities shall be deposited with th Cashier of the Fiscal Departmen The Chairman of the Committee will advise the applicant, at the time o issuance of his permit, if the actio funds is classed, by the committee, a a major activity
3. When deposits of funds ar made with the Cashier of the Fiscal Department they shall be credited under the name of the activity to which they belong. Such funds are be subject to check on the Cashi of the Fiscal Department on a vouch r approved by not less than three of ficers of such activity
4. When funds are solicited collected for any purpose the stude to whom authority is given for so-
liciting or collecting such funds shall file with the Chairman of the Com mittee on Student Activities, a co und list of the contributors to etin, at shall publish in tivity, a statement of the ac amount collected and expended in mountion

The Business Manag Longhorn shall be placed under bond of $\$ 1000$ to guarantee deliver of all books for which deposits hav been made and for the payment of all obligations contracted in the puh lation of the book.
