"Hig" passed fifteen yards to Alexander. It was a beautiful play, "Hig" slipping and falling twice before he could get the ball off. The A. and M. bleachers were in an uproar. Three line plays netted only two yards. Then Higginbotham got down to hold a placement and Baylod set her teeth to block that kick. "Hig" passed to Alexander who went thru four Baylor men and stopped in back of the goal posts. Higginbotham kicked goal, making the score: A. and M. 10, Baylor 0. The Baylor stands were very subdued. Baylor kicked off and A. and M. punted at once. On a pass Baylor made first down for the first time—after forty minutes of play. Another pass gained fifteen yards. Davis recovered a fumble in mid-field as the third quarter ended.

"Hig" punted and Baylor did the same after three passes had failed. A. and M. again kicked and Davis held the ball for no gain on Baylor's thirty yard line. Higginbotham intercepted a pass and was downed on the enemy twenty-yard line. Mahan took it five; but Martin fumbled and Baylor recovered, kicked and recovered the Aggie fumble of the punt on Baylor forty-yard line. The Bears passed for first down. A pair of punts gave Baylor the ball in mid-field where a pass gained thirty yards. Baylor was doing nothing but pass. Higginbotham intercepted one and ran to the fifty-yard line. Baylor recovered on A. and M. fumble. Dabney circled right end for twelve yards running out of bounds. The twentieth Baylor pass in as many minutes failed and the game ended. Score: A. and M. 10, Baylor 0.

**REGULATIONS REGARDING FUNDS FOR STUDENT ACTIVITIES**

Paragraph 49 of the College Regulations provides that the collecting of funds for any student activity or

enterprise shall be done only with the written consent of the President of the College and in accordance with regulations of the Committee on Student Activities. This request must be made through the Chairman of the Committee on Student Activities. The Also that the disbursement of such funds shall be made in accordance with regulations established or approved by the Committee.

The Committee has established only a few regulations which have been approved by the President and which are published below:

1. The Written consent to collect funds will be issued in triplicate on a printed form, by the Chairman of the Committee on Student Activities. The original will be given to the student, the duplicate will be retained by the Chairman and the triplicate be filed in the President's office. The permit will specify the purpose for which the funds are to be used and will state the approximate amount to be collected.

2. Funds for all major student activities shall be deposited with the Cashier of the Fiscal Department. The Chairman of the Committee will advise the applicant, at the time of issuance of his permit, if the activity for which he desires to solicit funds is classed, by the committee, as a major activity.

3. When deposits of funds are made with the Cashier of the Fiscal Department they shall be credited under the name of the activity to which they belong. Such funds are to be subject to check on the Cashier of the Fiscal Department on a voucher approved by not less than three officers of such activity.

4. When funds are solicited or collected for any purpose the student to whom authority is given for soliciting or collecting such funds shall file with the Chairman of the Com-

mittee on Student Activities, a correct list of the contributors to such fund and shall publish in the Bulletin, at the completion of the activity, a statement of the total amount collected and expended in connection with such activity.

5. The Business Manager of the Longhorn shall be placed under a bond of \$1000 to guarantee delivery of all books for which deposits have been made and for the payment of all obligations contracted in the publication of the book.

**MEMORIAL STADIUM PLANNED FOR A. AND M.**

Before many days we will be able to witness the starting of work on the new Stadium on the athletic field. This construction is to be the most modern in the state of Texas and besides this—it is to be large enough to accommodate the vast crowds that gather here to witness an Aggie football contest. The erection of this addition to the Campus will satisfy a need that has long been greatly felt by the athletes of this College.

The Stadium is to extend the length of the football field and is to consist of two rows of boxes and twenty rows of seats, the plans calling for a depth of 65 feet and a seating capacity of six thousand. Underneath is to be located the club rooms for our teams and the visitors and are to be equipped with hot and cold showers, electric fans and other modern apparatus which is associated with such an improvement. The memorial room is to be a room open at all times to visitors, and is to contain a service record of every A. and M. man—a special tablet of gold

stars being provided for those who made the supreme sacrifice. The trophy room is to be all that the name implies—in that all trophies such as cups, medals, banners and footballs used in the big games are to be perpetuated here. It will also contain a picture of all athletes together with their records, and a section reserved for individual pictures of "T" men. Under each of these individual pictures will be found the man's name, the sport or sports he participated in, with the year.

This magnificent structure is to be built of reinforced concrete, the plans for which are now being drawn by Prof. J. J. Richie of the Civil Engineering department. It is hoped that the first section will be completed by the end of the present year. It

is to cost \$40,000, \$5,000 of which the Alumni has been asked to contribute. It is unnecessary to say that the full amount will undoubtedly be obtained and hence the hopes of students for ages will be realized.
