More Accomplished Artist Secured to Fill the Place of Miss Farnier Whose Voice Failed.

Of more than passing interest is the fact that fifty-eight towns where Miss Martino appeared, asked for a second appearance during the winter season immediately following.

During the fall of 1919, Miss Martino has been singing for the Edison Company and next season will be one of their regularly advertised "Recreation Artists." The managers are most enthusiastic over her work.
