## A VOTE TO BE TAKEN ON THE BLANKET TAX

Following Draft Endorsed by Members Student Activities Submitted for Consideration.

Following is a draft of the Blanket Tax as endorsed by the representatives of Student Activities and the ratification of which is desired by the student body:

Be it enacted by the students of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas:

### Section 1.

a. Each student shall, upon matriculation before the Christmas holidays, shall pay a Students' Activity Fee (Blanket Tax) of thirteen dollars and fifty cents (\$13.50).

b. Each new student who matriculates any time after the Christmas Holidays shall pay a Students' Activity Fee (Blanket Tax) of eight dollars and twenty five cents (\$8.25).

c. The following may have the privilege of paying any apportionment of the fee that the payer may desire:

(1) Faculty members of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas.

(2) Employees of the College, Agricultural Experiment Station, and of the Extension Service.

(3) Citizens of Bryan, Texas.

(4) Students and faculty members of Bryan High School.

(5) Students and faculty members of the Public Schools of Bryan.

(6) Students and faculty members of Allen Academy, Bryan Texas.

(7) Students and faculty members of Villa Maria, Bryan, Texas.

(a) The amount of the fee charged to any person paying this tax under Section 1, c, shall be governed according to the time it is paid, and the activity, or activities, the payer is interested in.

d. Any person who is eligible to pay the fee is denied the privilege of paying it more than once, however, if additional benefits are desired, the Business Manager of the
