

TENNIS ASSOCIATION TOURNAMENT OPEN

The College Tennis Association opens its first tournament on Saturday afternoon of March 20. This tournament is unofficial and is open to all members of the association. The play will be in singles only and will give the coach, Professor W. H. Thomas, a clearer idea of the line-up of available material. Immediately following this unofficial tournament regular play will be begun to decide upon the members of a squad of approximately eight men.

Arrangements have been made to place the training squad at the training table in the mess hall, and a picture of the squad will be made in time for the issue of the Longhorn. Two courts will be reserved for the squad and the men will play regularly under the close tutelage of Mr. Thomas. The Coach is confident that fast teams can be developed from the material available.

Plans are being made for a complete tournament within the College before the end of this school term. The play will consist of singles, mens doubles and mixed doubles. Appropriate trophies will be presented to the winners in each division.

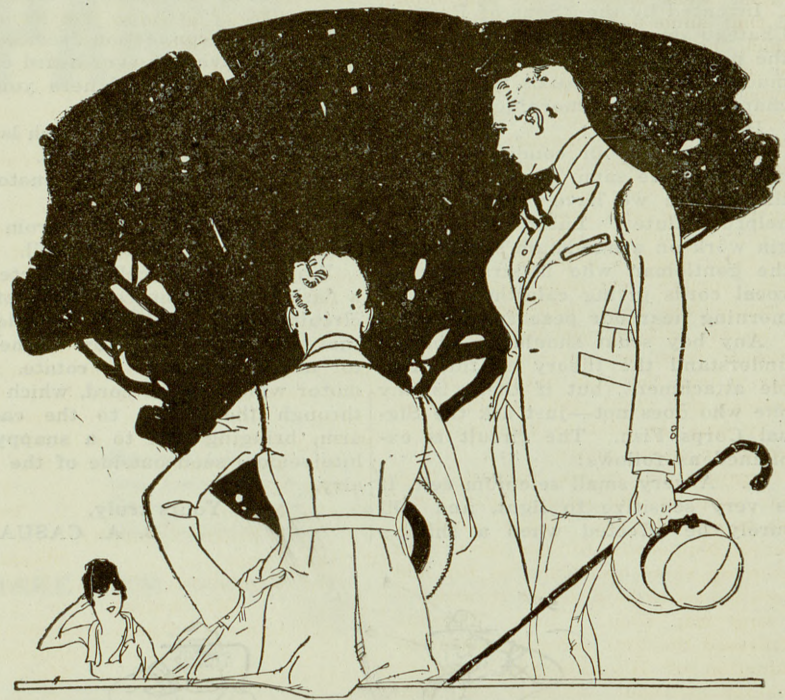

The camps for instruction in infantry for students in the Reserve Officers Training Corps attending colleges in Oklahoma and Texas will be held at Camp Benning, Georgia.

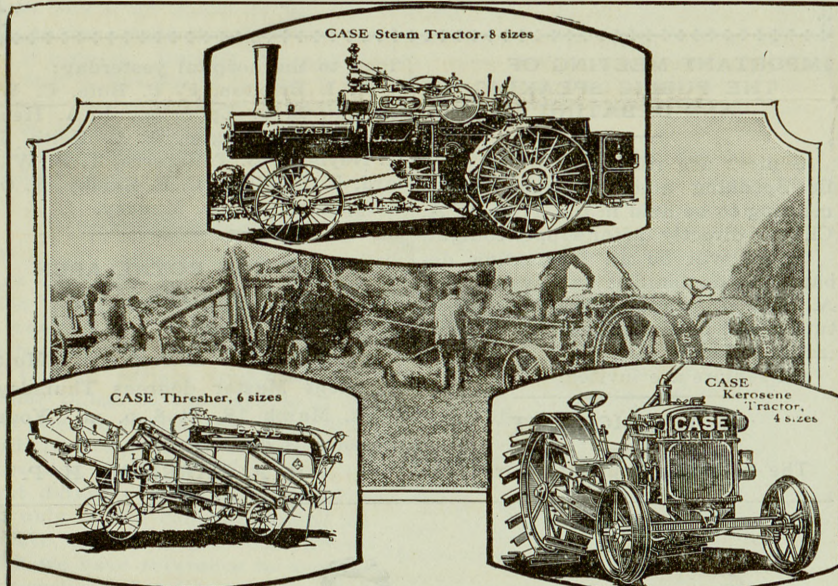
