

LITERARY WORKS ON GREAT THEME OF MOTHERS DAY

Professor Mayo Has Prepared a Special Shelf of Stories and Poems in the Library.

In honor of Mother's Day, for the celebration of which Sunday, May 9, has been designated, a Special Shelf will be selected in the Library, consisting of stories and poems on this greatest of themes. Whistler's celebrated "Portrait of His Mother" kindly loaned by a resident of the Campus, with copies of short poems which are interesting in this connection, will be on view, and students are invited in to see this imperishable monument which a great man has left to his best friend. The books and the picture will be available from Thursday to Sunday. A list of the stories on the special shelf includes the following:

- (1) "Mother", by Maxim Gorky; this is a story of Revolutionary Russia, dealing with a little old woman whose irrepressible instinct to mother everybody softened the harshness and turbulence in the midst of which she is thrown.
- (2) "Mother", by Kathleen Norris; a story of simple American home life, with the Mother as the heroine.
- (3) "Margaret Ogilvy", by her son, J. M. Barrie; this little book is the true story of Barrie's Scotch mother, told with that author's inimitable mixture of humor and tenderness.
- (4) "Echoes of the War", by J. M. Barrie (especially the sketches "The Old Lady Shows Her Medals," "The New Word," and "A Well-Remembered Voice.")
- (5) "The Awakening of Helena Richie," by Margaret Deland; the story of a woman who was redeemed by her love for her son.
- (6) "Mother", by Lawrence Perry (Century Magazine).
